Linda only drank once a year, but when she did, she didn't stop until she passed out, often ending up in the hospital. The rest of the year she was treated for depression, but eventually drank to help herself feel better.

Thousands of Siouxlanders have addictions problems like Linda, or are abusing substances without understanding

the impact on their health.

Now, patients at Siouxland Community Health Center are being screened for substance use. A trained therapist



helps them identify any behaviors or addiction-related problems affecting their health.


Over 2,700 screenings have been completed, and the results have been astounding.
