addiction because they feel it's a secret. This setting will make it safe to learn about addiction, treatment and recovery.

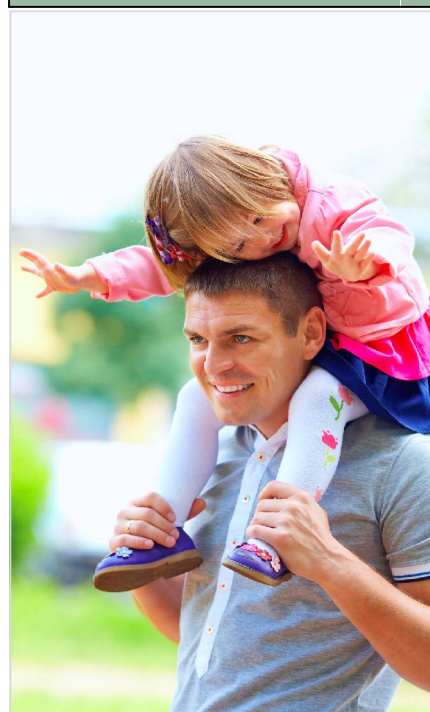
"We want to teach them how to share their feelings with safe people. We want them to know they can get help to feel better and safe," says
